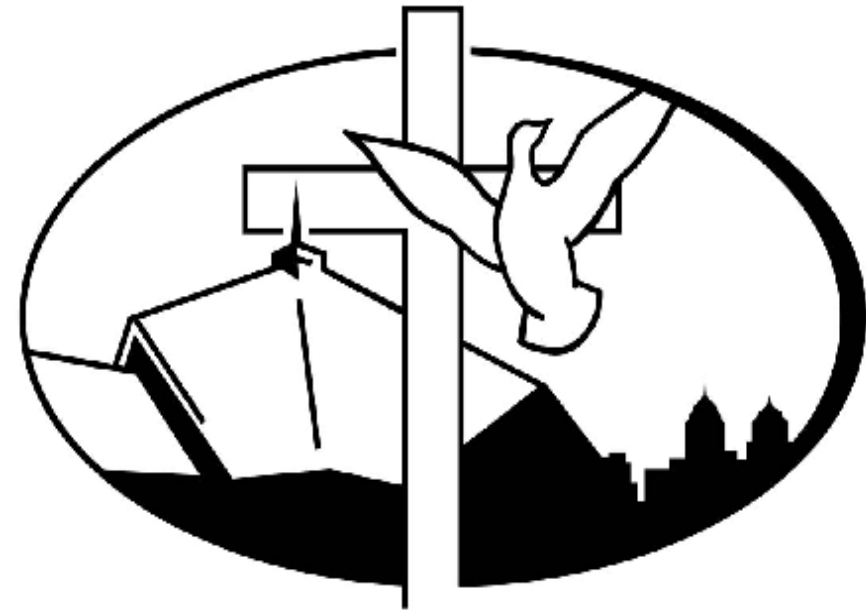

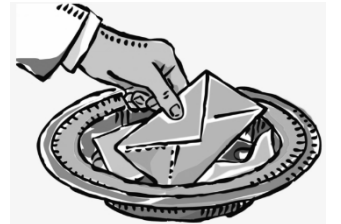
ANNOUNCEMENTS
